- I gave an update on our radio system to the VBC Fire Chiefs Association.
- We took a class on My Three Words by Rapid SOS. It’s a very cool location feature.
- Ashley and I are working very hard to get our One Map System set up the way we like it.
- I’ve just received permission and taken classes on how to enter the 911 Public Safety Platform by AT&T. This is so I can make changes or add streets to the Master Street Address Guide (MSAG).
- We had a record number of calls this month beating out March 2021 with 1033 calls. Prior to that was July 2019 with 970.

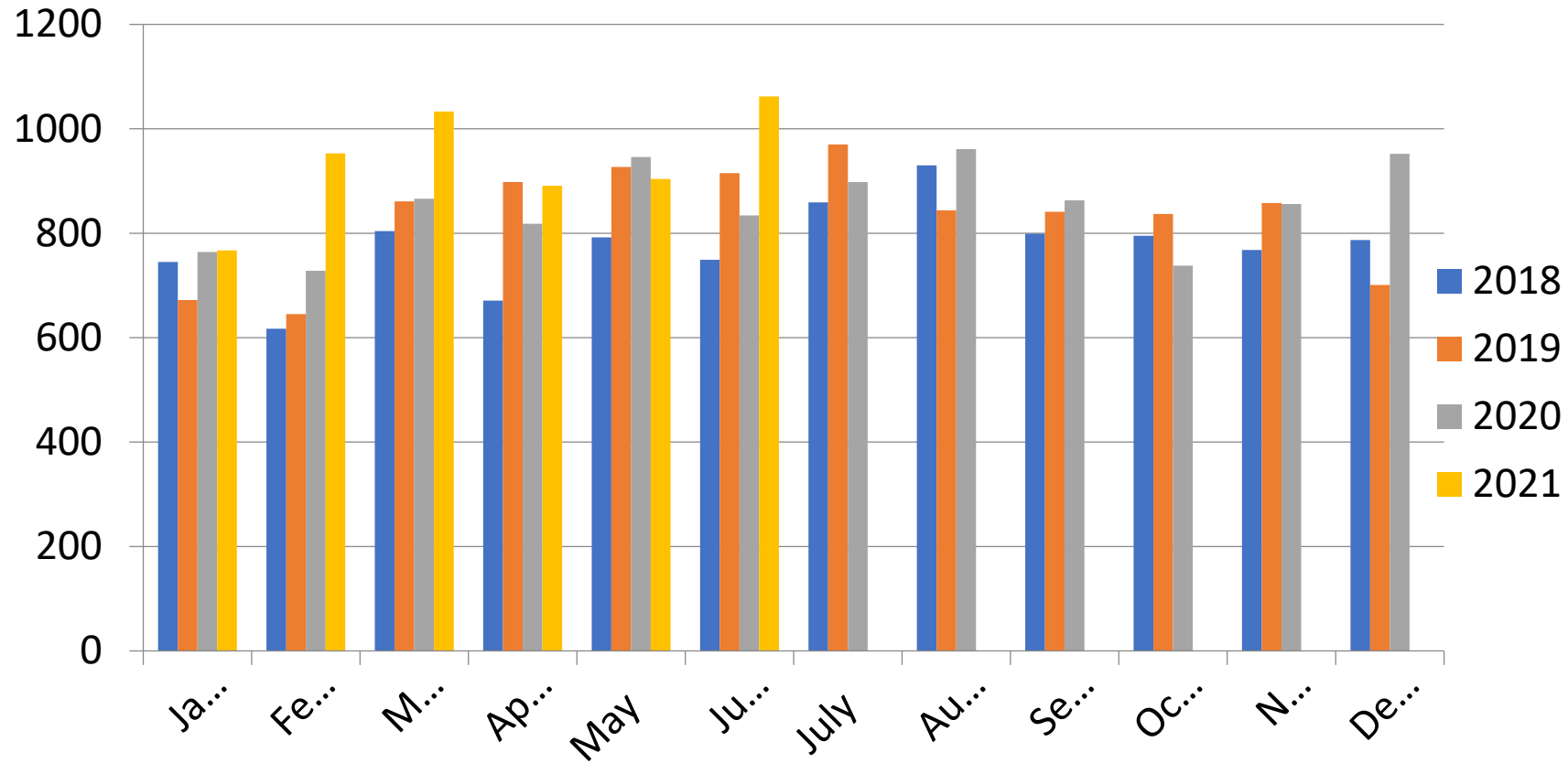

GRANTS Carried Over To- 2021

Applied for State Aid Road Grant for 2021- \$300 K- This will be for Snead Drive and part of Woodlawn up to the East Cliff cross street.

Recreation Trail Grant for Walkway to Cave- Is complete and we will be filing closing grant paperwork.

Recreation Trail Grant- Motorized – ATV/UTV- \$337,000- Start Date Mid Summer 2021- Survey should take place in late July or early August. Then can move forward with grant.

CLG Grant- Petroglyph Documentation, Educational Materials and Web Site Development – Still waiting to get this closed out. Submitted the paperwork.

New Grants Applied for-2021

- Police- \$255,000.00 Local Law Enforcement Grant
- Fire Department Submitted 2 grants for the next cycle:
 - 1) Firefighter PPE cleaning and drying equipment \$20,000 City share is \$1,000
 - 2) Replacement Brush Truck \$165,000- City Share \$8,250

Grants Received in 2021

- Police- Received 7K grant from the Arkansas State Police and Highway Safety Office- No match required.
- We received a \$7,500 grant for the Recycle Center through the Solid Waste and Recycle Grant Program. We paid the bill for our part of the new roof on the recycle center and have submitted for grant reimbursement.

Mayor's report

- Received word from FEMA that they will only cover part of our Covid-19 claim. We submitted \$47,176.32 and they approved \$5,982.31
- July 3rd Independence Day at the Bay was a BIG success. Lots of people and the Marina had a great turn out. Hotel was sold out and the Resort reported great sales numbers. I will be reaching out to the Resort to set the date for next year.
- The city conference room is going to be remodeled so we can accommodate more citizens during meetings. If the construction goes as planned I hope to move City Council meetings back to City offices in September. The remodel will allow for up to 100 to be seated in the conference room.
